Introduction

To be known as the School of Biological Sciences Prize in Master of Biotechnology (Biomedical). This prize was set up by the School of Biological Sciences in 2014. The prize is to be awarded to the most outstanding student enrolled full time for two years in the Master of Biotechnology (Biomedical) program. The prize is to be awarded once per annum to the value of \$500.

Prize Rules

Name of prize	School of Biological Sciences Prize in Master of Biotechnology (Biomedical)
Awarded by	The School of Biological Sciences, Faculty of Sciences, University of Adelaide.
Awarded to	A current student studying in the Master of Biotechnology (Biomedical) Program
Awarded for	The student placed highest in order of merit across the whole program, including coursework and research year. This will be determined by their overall GPA for the Master of Biotechnology (Biomedical) degree.
Selection criteria	The award winner shall be determined by a consensus of the staff member(s) teaching into the program outlined above. The prize will be awarded to the student placed highest in order of merit across the whole program, including coursework and research year. This will be determined by their overall GPA for the Master of Biotechnology (Biomedical) degree.
Value of prize	\$500 or such other amount as the School of Biological Sciences shall from time to time determine.
General	If there is more than one student considered worthy in any given year and a majority consensus cannot be made by the staff, the prizes may be awarded to the potential recipients. If the course given above is, for whatever reason, not run in a particular year the prize is not to be awarded. If in any year, the School of Biological Sciences considers that there is no candidate of sufficient merit, no award will be made. The prize will be recorded on the student transcript. The award title and these rules may be varied from time to time by the Faculty in consultation with the School of Biological Sciences.
Period of agreement	An annual review of the prize and rules will be conducted by the School of Biological Sciences.
