## School of Biological Sciences Prize in Level 3 Biochemistry

### Introduction

To be known as the School of Biological Sciences Prize in Level 3 Biochemistry. This prize was set up by the School of Molecular and Biomedical Science in 2010. A prize is to be awarded to the most outstanding student enrolled in both a Semester 1 and a Semester 2, Level 3 course offered in Biochemistry in the School of Biological Sciences. The prize is to be given once per annum to the value of \$200.

### Prize Rules

<b>Name of prize</b>	School of Biological Sciences Prize in Level 3 Biochemistry
<b>Awarded by</b>	The School of Biological Sciences, Faculty of Sciences, University of Adelaide.
<b>Awarded to</b>	A current student studying a Bachelor of Science Degree Program
<b>Awarded for</b>	The most outstanding student in both a Semester 1 and a Semester 2, Level 3 course offered in Biochemistry in the School of Biological Sciences.
<b>Selection criteria</b>	The award winner shall be determined by a consensus of the staff member(s) teaching into the courses outlined above. The award winner must have achieved the highest aggregate marks for both a Semester 1 and a Semester 2, Level 3 course offered in Biochemistry in the School of Biological Sciences.
<b>Value of prize</b>	\$200 or such other amount as the School of Biological Sciences shall from time to time determine.
<b>General</b>	If there is more than one student considered worthy any given year and a majority consensus cannot be made by the staff, the prizes may be awarded to the potential recipients. If the course given above is, for whatever reason, not run in a particular year the prize is not to be awarded. If in any year, the School of Biological Sciences considers that there is no candidate of sufficient merit, no award will be made. The prize will be recorded on the student transcript. The award title and these rules may be varied from time to time by the Faculty in consultation with the School of Biological Sciences.
<b>Period of agreement</b>	An annual review of the prize and rules will be conducted by the School of Biological Sciences.
