THE JOHN BAGOT PRIZE AND MEDAL FOR BOTANY

Rules

In 1922 Mrs John Bagot donated £500 to the University to establish, in memory of her late husband, a scholarship and medal in Botany.

This is an endowed prize with the capital held in the University's Endowment Fund¹ and the income distribution each year used to fund the prize.

- 1. Two prizes and a medal, to be called 'The John Bagot Prize (and Medal) for Botany', shall be available for award annually.
- 2. The prizes shall be awarded as follows:
 - a. The first prize shall be awarded to the student who achieves the highest aggregate marks in at least 2 Level I courses which include plant sciences in the Faculty of Sciences. The prize shall consist of:-
 - \$500, or such other amount as the University shall from time to time determine provided that the value of the prize does not exceed the annual distribution of interest available from the Endowment Fund; and
 - ii. a suitably inscribed medal.
 - b. The second prize shall be awarded to the student who achieves the second highest aggregate marks in at least 2 Level I courses which include plant sciences in the Faculty of Sciences. The value of the prize shall be \$300.
- 3. The value of the prizes may vary from time to time provided that the value of the prizes does not exceed the annual distribution of interest available from the Endowment Fund.
- 4. If, in any year, two or more students obtain an equal aggregate score then the prize shall be shared equally amongst them.
- 5. Any surplus income which is not awarded as part of this prize shall be added to the capital sum in the Endowment Fund from time to time.
- 6. The University may vary the rules from time to time in a manner consistent with the University's legal obligations and <u>policies</u>.
