

THE DAVID HAYMAN PRIZE FOR GENETICS

Established through donations from the Miller family, the prize is in memory of Dr David L Hayman who was an academic staff member of the Genetics Department from 1959 to 1992 and a Visiting Research Fellow until his death in 2006.

The prize is awarded annually to the candidate placed highest in order of merit amongst those who are awarded First Class Honours in Genetics.

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THE DAVID HAYMAN PRIZE IN GENETICS

Rules

In 2006 the sum of \$10,000 was given to the University by the Miller family to establish a prize in memory of Dr David L Hayman who was an academic staff member of the Genetics Department from 1959 until his retirement in 1992 and a Visiting Research Fellow until his death in 2006. The fund was increased by another donation from the Miller family in 2011 of \$15,000. In 2015 the Miller family suggested that the prize be increased to \$2,500 per year and the capital spent out accordingly.

The following rules apply:-

- 1. The prize shall be known as "The David Hayman Prize in Genetics".
- 2. The prize will be awarded annually to the candidate placed highest in order of merit amongst those who are awarded First Class Honours in Genetics.
- 3. The prize will be awarded in December, and students completing honours courses in Genetics in the calendar year of the award are eligible.
- 4. The value of the prize will be \$2,500 per year.
- 5. The University may vary the rules from time to time in a manner consistent with the University's legal obligations and <u>policies</u>.
