THE RUSSELL BAUDINETTE TRAVEL SCHOLARSHIP Rules

In 2005, a generous founding donation of \$5,000 was made to the University from Ms Kaye Baudinette, along with additional funds from former colleagues, as a memorial to Professor Russell Baudinette and in recognition of his invaluable contribution to research and teaching, to establish a postgraduate travel scholarship.

The following rules now apply:-

- 1. There shall be a postgraduate scholarship known as the 'Russell Baudinette Travel Scholarship'.
- 2. One scholarship will be awarded annually to a talented, full-time PhD student currently enrolled at the University of Adelaide and undertaking research on whole animal biology of Australian native animals, particularly in the areas of physiology or ecology. The maximum value of the scholarship in any year will be \$1,000.
- 3. The purpose of the scholarship is to provide financial support to attend an international or national conference to present a paper or poster, with the aim of providing the recipient with the opportunity for promotion and exposure to international and national researchers.
- 4. Each applicant is required to submit an application on the prescribed form by the closing date for travel to be undertaken between January and December in the following calendar year.
- 5. The successful applicant will be expected to submit a brief report to the Head of the School of Biological Sciences within three months of their return. A copy of the report is also to be forwarded to Kaye and Emma Baudinette.
- 6. The decision on the awarding of the scholarship will be made by the Head of the School of Biological Sciences.
- 8. The closing date for applications for the scholarship will be 31 October in each year.
- 9. The University reserves the right not to make an offer in any year subject to funding and availability of suitable applicants.
- 10. The University may vary the rules from time to time in a manner consistent with the University's legal obligations and policies.
