Prize Rules

Establishment

This Prize has been established by a donation to the University by the Botanic Gardens of South Australia, in honour of Allan Dale Correy and the contribution he made to the landscape architecture profession in South Australia including preparation of the master plan for the Mount Lofty Botanic Garden

Value

The value of the Prize will be \$500.00 per year for 3 years until otherwise determined by the University after discussions with the donor.

Eligibility

The prize is awarded by the University annually and on the following eligibility criteria: that the student must be studying full-time in the final year of their program for the degree of Bachelor of Architectural Design.

Selection of Candidate


The School's Learning Committee will award the prize to the student(s) who have achieved the highest aggregate of marks in the following courses:

- Design Studio 5 (DESST 3513)
- Construction 3 (DESST 3514)
- Representation 3 (DESST 3515)
- Design Studio 6 (DESST 3516)

If there is more than one candidate of equal merit, then the prize may be shared equally.
