

The David A.L. Saunders Prize for History and Theories of Architecture Rules

Background

In 1988, Doreen A Saunders gave \$3,000 to the University to establish an annual prize to commemorate the memory of Professor David A.L. Saunders, Professor of Architecture 1977-86, and to encourage the study of the history of architecture.

The following Rules now apply:-

- 1. The Prize shall be known as "The David A.L. Saunders Prize for History and Theories of Architecture."
- 2. The value of the Prize shall be \$700 or such other amount as the University shall from time to time determine provided that the value of the Prize does not exceed the annual income distribution from the Endowment Fund.
- 3. The Prize shall be awarded annually to the student who achieves the highest marks in the course History Theory 1 (DESST 1505) in the Bachelor of Architectural Design program.
- 4. Where two or more candidates are of equal merit, the Prize shall be shared equally.
- 5. If there is no candidate of sufficient merit in any given year then the prize will not be awarded in that year and the available distribution of interest shall be added to the capital sum in the Endowment Fund.
- 6. The University may vary the rules from time to time in a manner consistent with the University's legal obligations and <u>policies</u>.
