
The Dr George Sved Prize for Civil Engineering Rules

Establishment

In 1995, family and friends of Dr George Sved, AM, paid to the University \$5,000 to establish a prize in his memory. Dr Sved taught at the University of Adelaide from 1950 to 1975, and continued to provide academic assistance as an Honorary Visiting Research Fellow until his death in 1994.

In 2006, Dr Marta Sved bequeathed \$2,000 to the University to be added to the fund for the Dr George Sved Prize in Civil Engineering.

This is an endowed prize with the capital held in the University's Endowment Fund and the income distribution each year used to fund the prize.

Value

The value of the Prize is \$500 per year, or such other amount as the University shall from time to time determine provided that the value of the prize does not exceed the annual distribution of interest available from the Endowment Fund¹.

Eligibility

The prize is awarded by the University annually to the student who obtains the best result in the assessment of the Level II course CEME 2001 Strength of Materials.

Selection of Candidate

The School of Civil, Environmental and Mining Engineering will award the prize to the successful candidate.

If there is no candidate of sufficient merit in any given year then the funds will be added to the capital sum invested in the Endowment Fund.
